HOW TO PREPARE FOR CHEMICAL TREATMENT

PRIOR TO TREATMENT

Preparation for Treatment:

Please ensure that the unit is prepared for treatment upon the technician's arrival. We ask that you be mindful of the technician's time, as well as the other residents waiting for treatment. Technicians cannot wait, so if you are not prepared, the treatment will be canceled, and a cancellation fee will apply.

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least ****SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait ****24 hours**** before reintroducing exotic animals.

1. Identify Affected Areas

Inspect your home, particularly in attics, walls, and around windows and doors, to locate areas where cluster flies are congregating.

2. Clear Obstructions

Remove any furniture, decorations, or items that may obstruct treatment areas, especially around windows and entry points

3. Seal Entry Points

Thoroughly check for cracks and gaps around windows, doors, and siding. Seal these entry points with caulk or weather stripping to prevent flies from entering

4. Remove Food Sources

While cluster flies are less attracted to food than other fly species, it's still advisable to maintain cleanliness. Ensure all food items are stored properly and clean up any spills or crumbs.

5. Minimize Light Exposure

Turn off outdoor lights at night, if possible, as bright lights can attract cluster flies. Consider using yellow-toned bulbs that are less attractive to insects



POST-TREATMENT GUIDELINES

1. Do Not Disturb Treated Areas

Avoid cleaning or disturbing treated areas for at least ****24 to 48 hours**** after application to allow the treatment to take full effect.

2. Ventilate the Area

After the waiting period, open windows and doors to ventilate treated spaces, helping to clear any residual odor from the treatment

3. Monitor for Activity

Keep an eye on the treated areas for any remaining or new cluster fly activity. If you notice any, contact your pest control service for a follow-up.

4. Regular Cleaning

Continue to maintain cleanliness in your home. Vacuum up any dead flies and keep surfaces clear of dust and debris.

5. Seal New Entry Points

Regularly inspect your home for any new cracks or potential entry points, especially after seasonal changes.

6. Use Preventive Measures

Consider installing fine mesh screens on windows and doors to keep cluster flies out. You may also consider using sticky traps in areas where flies are likely to gather

No Pesticides or Cleaning Products

Do not spray any pesticides or cleaning products in treated areas after the treatment, as this may lead to control failure.
