### **HOW TO PREPARE FOR CHEMICAL TREATMENT**

#### **Flea Treatment Instructions**

##### **Preparation for Treatment:**

Please ensure that the unit is prepared for treatment upon the technician's arrival. We ask that you be mindful of the technician's time, as well as the other residents waiting for treatment. Technicians cannot wait, so if you are not prepared, the treatment will be canceled, and a cancellation fee will apply.

##### **Mandatory Evacuation Period:**

###### **All adults and children**

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **\*\*SIX (6) HOURS**.

###### **Caged Pets Protocol:**

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait **\*\*24 hours\*\*** before reintroducing exotic animals.

##### **Thoroughly Vacuum**

Vacuum floors, rugs, and upholstered furniture, paying extra attention to areas where pets sleep or rest.

- Immediately dispose of the vacuum contents in a sealed plastic bag outdoors to prevent fleas from escaping.

##### **3. Launder Fabrics**

- Wash and dry pet bedding, throw rugs, and any other fabrics (e.g., blankets, cushion covers) at the highest heat setting.
- Seal freshly laundered items in clean plastic bags or bins to keep them free of fleas before and after treatment.

##### **4. Remove or Cover Pet Items**

- Take away any pet dishes, toys, bedding, and litter boxes from the treatment area. Store them in sealed containers or

**remove them from the home.**

- Make sure all pet food is in airtight containers or moved out of reach of the treatment zones.

##### **5. Clear Floors & Under Furniture**

- Move small items, toys, or clutter off the floor to allow thorough application along baseboards, in corners, and under furniture.
- Consider moving larger furniture three inches from walls if you suspect fleas are present behind or beneath them.

##### **6. Address Outdoor Areas (If Applicable)**

- If fleas have been found outdoors in areas your pets frequent, clear away debris such as leaves or grass clippings. A light trimming of grass and foliage can also help.

## POST-TREATMENT GUIDELINES

### 2. Ventilate

- Once you are back, open windows or use fans to air out any remaining odor or fumes.

### 3. Avoid Immediate Cleaning

- Avoid vacuuming or shampooing carpets for at least 1–2 weeks (or as directed) to allow the residual insecticide to continue targeting fleas.
- Light cleaning in non-treated areas is okay, but do not mop or wipe down surfaces that have been treated unless otherwise instructed.

### 4. Continue to Monitor & Vacuum

- Even after treatment, you may see fleas for a brief period as eggs hatch and come into contact with the insecticide.
- After the waiting period specified by your technician, vacuum carpets, and furniture regularly to remove dead fleas and stimulate any remaining eggs to hatch (so the residual insecticide can affect them).

### 5. Launder Pet Bedding

- Maintain a routine of washing pet bedding on a hot cycle to prevent re-infestation.

### 6. Treat Pets for Fleas

- Consult your veterinarian for appropriate flea treatments on your pets (e.g., spot-on treatments, oral medications, flea collars).
- This helps prevent fleas from simply re-infesting the home after your professional treatment.

### 7. Follow-Up Treatments

- Severe infestations might require multiple visits. Adhere to any follow-up schedule your technician recommends.

## No Pesticides or Cleaning Products

Do not spray any pesticides or cleaning products in treated areas after the treatment, as this may lead to control failure.
