Preparation for Treatment:

Please ensure that the unit is prepared for treatment upon the technician's arrival. We ask that you be mindful of the technician's time, as well as the other residents waiting for treatment. Technicians cannot wait, so if you are not prepared, the treatment will be canceled, and a cancellation fee will apply.

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least ****SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait ****24 hours**** before reintroducing exotic animals.

PRIOR TO TREATMENT

Identify Infested Areas

Locate Breeding Sites

Check areas where fruit flies are commonly found, such as kitchens, fruit bowls, garbage cans, and recycling bins. Look for signs of adult flies, larvae, or small clusters around decaying fruits and vegetables.

Inspect Drains and Garbage

Verify that drains, trash cans, and compost bins are also inspected, as fruit flies can breed in these areas.

Clear the Treatment Areas

Remove Food Sources

Dispose of any overripe or rotting fruits and vegetables. Seal any remaining produce in airtight containers or refrigerate them.

Declutter Surface

Clear countertops and tables of any food items, dishes, and clutter that could provide breeding sites for fruit flies.

Clean Thoroughly

Wipe Down Surfaces

Clean countertops, tables, and surfaces where food is prepared or consumed. Use hot soapy water to remove any residues that may attract fruit flies.

Empty Trash Bins

Take out the trash and clean the bins to eliminate any leftover food or organic matter that could attract flies.

Follow Pre-Treatment Instructions

Remove or Cover Food

Ensure all food items are removed or sealed. Cover any food that cannot be moved.

Close Windows and Doors

Make sure all windows and outside doors are closed prior to treatment to contain the infestation within the treatment area.

Post-Treatment Guidelines

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Monitor for Continued Activity

After treatment, keep an eye on the areas for any signs of fruit fly activity. If you notice new flies, contact the exterminator for follow-up treatment.

No Pesticides or Cleaning Products

Do not spray any pesticides or cleaning products in treated areas after the treatment, as this may lead to control failure.

Prevent Future Infestations

Practice Good Hygiene

Regularly clean kitchens and dining areas, promptly dispose of expired produce, and avoid leaving food out in the open.

Store Produce Properly

Keep fruits and vegetables stored in the refrigerator or sealed containers to minimize attractants for fruit flies.

- **Regular Inspections**: Conduct regular checks of storage areas for any signs of fruit flies or organic matter.

Inform Family Members

Make sure everyone in the house understands how to identify fruit flies and the importance of keeping food stored properly and kitchens clean.
