**HOW TO PREPARE FOR CHEMICAL TREATMENT**

**Preparation for Treatment:**

Please ensure that the unit is prepared for treatment upon the technician's arrival. We ask that you be mindful of the technician's time, as well as the other residents waiting for treatment. Technicians cannot wait, so if you are not prepared, the treatment will be canceled, and a cancellation fee will apply.

**Mandatory Evacuation Period:**

**All adults and children**

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **SIX (6) HOURS**.

**Caged Pets Protocol:**

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait **24 hours** before reintroducing exotic animals.

**PRE-TREATMENT PREPARATION**

**Identify Infestation Areas**

- Pill bugs (roly-polies) are usually found near moisture sources—around doors, basements, bathrooms, potted plants, and damp crawl spaces.
- Share known hotspots with your Pest B Gone technician so they can target those locations thoroughly.

**Reduce Moisture**

- Pill bugs thrive in damp environments. Fix leaks, wipe up standing water, and check indoor humidity levels.
- Ensure proper ventilation in bathrooms, basements, or other humid spaces.

**Clean & Declutter**

- Vacuum or sweep floors, especially around baseboards, corners, and beneath furniture.
- Dispose of vacuum contents in a sealed bag outside to avoid reintroducing bugs.
- Remove any piles of boxes, papers, or clutter that may serve as hiding spots.

**Store or Cover Food & Kitchenware**

- Seal open food (including pet food) in airtight containers or move it away from treatment zones.
- Cover or remove dishes, utensils, and cookware from counters to prevent contamination.

**Move Furniture**

- If pill bugs have been spotted behind or under large furniture, pull these items two feet away from walls so the technician can access baseboards and hidden areas.

## POST-TREATMENT GUIDELINES

### Re-Entry Time

#### **Mandatory Evacuation Period:**

##### **All adults and children**

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **SIX (6) HOURS**.

#### **Caged Pets Protocol:**

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait **24 hours** before reintroducing exotic animals.

### Ventilate

- Upon re-entry, open windows or use fans to circulate fresh air and disperse any residual odor.

### Avoid Immediate Cleaning

- Do not mop, wipe, or scrub treated floors, baseboards, or walls for 1–2 weeks (or as advised). This allows the residual insecticide to remain effective.
- Light cleaning in areas not treated is typically fine.

### 4. Monitor Activity

- It is normal to see some pill bugs for a brief time after treatment as they encounter the residual product. Activity should diminish noticeably over the next few days.

### Continue Reducing Moisture

- Keep areas as dry as possible—fix leaks, use dehumidifiers if needed, and maintain proper ventilation.
- Since pill bugs rely on moist conditions, lower humidity discourages re-infestation.

### Seal Entry Points

- Once treatment is complete, identify and seal cracks or gaps around doors, windows, and foundations to prevent new infestations.
- Consider using weather stripping or caulk where needed.

### Follow-Up Treatments

- Severe infestations may require a second application or routine inspections. Follow any schedule provided by your technician.

### No Pesticides or Cleaning Products

Do not spray any pesticides or cleaning products in treated areas after the treatment, as this may lead to control failure.
