HOW TO PREPARE FOR ACTISOL TREATMENT

Preparation for Treatment:

Please ensure that the unit is prepared for treatment upon the technician's arrival. We ask that you be mindful of the technician's time, as well as the other residents waiting for treatment. Technicians cannot wait, so if you are not prepared, the treatment will be canceled, and a cancellation fee will apply.

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least ****SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait ****24 hours**** before reintroducing exotic animals.

PRIOR TO TREATMENT

1. Identify Affected Areas:

- Inspect and identify where you have seen roaches or their droppings. Common areas include kitchens, bathrooms, basements, and around appliances.

2. Remove Food Sources:

- Clear all food items from countertops, cabinets, and pantries. Store food in airtight containers and remove any open packages. This includes pet food—make sure it is sealed and stored securely.

3. Clean Thoroughly:

- Vacuum and clean all surfaces in infested areas. Pay special attention to corners, under appliances, and other places where food debris might accumulate. This will help eliminate potential food sources and existing roach populations.

4. Clear Clutter:

- Remove clutter from cabinets, countertops, and floors. This includes papers, containers, and unnecessary items that could provide hiding spots for roaches.

5. Seal Entry Points:

- Inspect your home for cracks, gaps, and holes in walls, around windows and doors, and near plumbing. Seal these entry points to help prevent roaches from entering your home.

6. Move Furniture and Appliances:

- To facilitate treatment access, remove or move furniture, appliances, or other items away from walls two feet . This allows the treatment to reach areas where roaches may hide.

Post-Treatment Guidelines:

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait **24 hours** before reintroducing exotic animals.

No Pesticides or Cleaning Products

Do not spray any pesticides or cleaning products in treated areas after the treatment, as this may lead to control failure.

- 1. Do Not Clean Immediately:**
 - Avoid vacuuming or cleaning the treated areas for at least **7 days** after the treatment. This allows the treatment to effectively eliminate any remaining roaches and their eggs.
- 2. Monitor for Activity:**
 - Keep an eye on treated areas for any signs of continued roach activity, such as droppings or new sightings. If you observe signs after a week, contact Pest B Gone Inc. for a follow-up evaluation.
- 3. Maintain Regular Cleaning:**
 - After the waiting period, resume cleaning and vacuuming regularly to prevent attracting new roaches. Focus on areas where food is stored and prepared.
- 4. Seal New Entry Points:**
 - Continue to inspect your home after treatment for any new cracks or gaps, and seal them promptly to help prevent future infestations.
- 5. Follow-Up Treatment:**
 - If you notice signs of roach activity after the initial treatment period, please contact us for a follow-up consultation and any necessary additional treatments.
