Preparation for Treatment:

Please ensure that the unit is prepared for treatment upon the technician's arrival. We ask that you be mindful of the technician's time, as well as the other residents waiting for treatment. Technicians cannot wait, so if you are not prepared, the treatment will be canceled, and a cancellation fee will apply.

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Remove any birds and other caged pets (including fish and reptiles) from the residence during treatment. For fish tanks, turn off pumps and filters, and cover the tank with plastic wrap. Wait **24 hours** before reintroducing exotic animals.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR CHEMICAL TREATMENT

PRIOR TO TREATMENT

Clear the Treatment Areas

1. Declutter

Remove items from floors, shelves, and corners that can hinder the exterminator's access to spider-prone areas. This includes boxes, clothing, and furniture.

Move Furniture, if possible, move furniture away from walls to allow easy access to treatment areas like baseboards and corners.

2. Clean Thoroughly

Dust surfaces and vacuum floors to remove webs, spiders, and eggs. Pay special attention to areas behind furniture, under beds, and in closets.

Use a damp cloth to wipe down surfaces to eliminate any remaining webs and spider eggs.

3. Plan for Pets and Children

Keep pets indoors or in a secure area away from treated zones during the extermination process to keep them safe. Make sure children stay away from treatment areas until the exterminator confirms it is safe.

Pre-Treatment Instructions

1. Seal Food and Personal Items

While spiders are not attracted to food in the same way other pests are, it is a good practice to seal food items and personal belongings to minimize any potential contamination.

2. Close Windows and Doors

Ensure that all windows and doors are closed before treatment begins to contain the treated area effectively.

Post Treatment

Monitor for Continued Activity

After treatment, keep an eye on the areas for any signs of fruit fly activity. If you notice new flies, contact Pest B Gone for follow-up treatment.

Mandatory Evacuation Period:

All adults and children

All individuals and pets must vacate the premises for a minimum of FOUR (4) hours after treatment. Individuals with allergies, respiratory issues, or who are pregnant should vacate for at least **SIX (6) HOURS**.

Caged Pets Protocol:

Cleaning

Do not vacuum or mop for 5 days after treatment.

No Pesticides or Cleaning Products: Do not spray any pesticides or cleaning products in treated areas after the treatment, as this may lead to control failure.

Prevent Future Infestations

Seal Cracks and Gaps

After treatment, inspect your home for gaps around windows, doors, and foundations and seal any openings to prevent spiders from entering.

Maintain Cleanliness

Regularly clean your home, paying particular attention to corners, baseboards, and areas where spiders are likely to create webs.

Limit Outdoor Lighting

Reduce outdoor lighting near entrances, as this can attract insects that draw spiders to your home.
